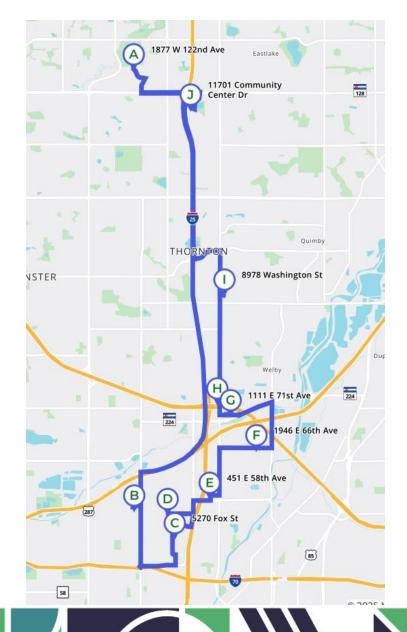

Availability -

Building 4: 43,458 SF

Building 5: 147,000 SF

Already leased: Pepsi, Lennox, Sunrun, Vartega, US Venture

Located in Adams County Enterprise Zone

Development includes shared tenant space, The Junction, including conference rooms, kitchen, showers, bike storage and outdoor patio space.

- Located in an Enterprise Zone
- Fun Fact: Quantum 56 is built on the Kopper's industrial wood treatment site which began treated wood on this site in 1927 and continued through 2020. Wood treatment primarily comprised of pressure treating railroad ties and telephone poles.

- Family-owned business that opened in 1988 with a strong focus on Sicilian tradition
- The majority of grapes are grown in Palisade, CO
- The CO wine industry generates close to \$5.72 billion in economic activity.
- Fun Fact: All wines are all natural and vegan

TruStile Doors, LLC.

1111 E 71st Avenue, Denver, CO

- The business opened in 1995 and was founded on design flexibility and customization principles with short lead times.
- 2015 acquired by The Marvin Company
- 350,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art manufacturing facility was opened in 2021
- Training transformation in partnership with Manufacturer's Edge led to 15 jobs created/retained, \$150k in new/retained sales, and \$327k in new investment.
- Fun Fact: CHFA was proud to award \$7.8 million in New Markets Tax Credits (NMTC) to TruStile Doors, LLC in 2019 to help finance the purchase and environmental remediation of the new facility location.







Boyer's – Maiker Housing future site

7295 Washington Street

- The property is part of the original Welby Neighborhood, and it had been used for residential purposes until rezoning to Industrial in 1987.
- From 1987 until a devastating fire in 2020, the property was used as a coffee roasting facility, warehouse and distribution site, and retail sales for Boyers Coffee.
- Maiker Housing Partners, housing authority for Adams County, acquired the site in 2023 as part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Affordable Housing Land Banking Program.
- Looking to build 117 affordable housing units and 4,200 square feet of commercial space.
- This grant program requires affordable housing rental projects to remain affordable for a minimum of 40 years.
- Fun Fact: Boyers coffeehouse was an original 1927 Schoolhouse for the area and will be partially restored as part of project.





Thornton Shopping Center Redevelopment

88th Avenue and Washington Street, Thornton, CO

- Thornton Development Authority (TDA) took title to the 15.86 acre property in April of 2024 and has successfully relocated tenants, demolished the buildings, and completed a community-based reuse visioning process.
- During the remainder of 2025, staff intends to continue environmental monitoring and cleanup activities and initiate the Redevelopment Request for Proposals Process
- Fun Fact: This project was selected for the 2025 NAIOP Rocky Mountain Real Estate Challenge between CU and DU





Northglenn Civic Center Master Plan

located on Community Center Drive across from E.B. Rains Jr. Memorial Park. Includes City Hall & the recreation center/senior center/theatre buildings.



- Phase I -
 - New Rec Center completed and open
- Phase II -
 - New City Hall Completion opened September 2024 Old City Hall Demolition (summer 2025)
- Phase III -
 - Demolitions of Old Rec Center complete Old Rec Center Land Remediation Private Re-development Opportunities...



• Fun Fact: Funding for the new City Hall, estimated at \$33.78M was wholly generated by existing 0.5% sales tax and 4% special marijuana tax.
