A snapshot of Adams County

- 1,184 sq. miles
- 2024 population: 542,973 (Census estimate)
- Cities and towns of:
 - Commerce City, Federal Heights, Northglenn, Thornton, Arvada, Aurora, Brighton, Westminster, Bennett, Lochbuie
 - Unincorporated communities of Henderson, Strasburg, and Watkins

Who We Are

- Younger median age than neighboring counties: 35.4
 - Jefferson: 40.2, Douglas: 39
 - Highest % of population in 25-44 age range
- 187,615 households (and growing!)
 - Median household income: \$81,482
 - Avg. household size: 2.9
 - Incomes have not kept pace with rising housing, COL
 - A diverse community: Majority-minority population
 - 55% non-white, with 43% Hispanic/Latino





FROM THE GROUND UP:

Where communities & possibilities grow

- From 2010-2020, Adams County saw an approx. 17% population increase (78,000 people!)
- One of the fastest-growing counties in the state
- Growth projected to continue, with an estimated population of 599,098 in 2030.
- With an annual growth rate of 3.8%, the county is projected to grow into the third-largest county in the Denver Council of Regional Governments (DRCOG) with a population of 722,807 by 2040.


WORKFORCE SNAPSHOT Diverse, balanced, resilient



- Total labor force: 296,407
- Number of jobs in Adams County: 275,016
- Unemployment rate: 5.1% (Dec. 2024)
- Workforce employed in wide variety of industries:
 - Largest employer is UC Health: University of Colorado Hospital (11,000)
 - Followed by:
 - Amazon (10,600)
 - Children's Hospital Colorado (6,100)
 - United Parcel Service (3,400)
 - Walmart (2,900)

- FedEx (2,600)
- Kroger (1,900)
- Sturgeon Electric (1,500)
- Shamrock Goods (1,400)
- Gaylord Rockies (1,100)
- Five largest employment sectors (% are for Adams as a whole)
 - Healthcare and Social Assistance (13.9%)

 - Construction (10.6%)
 - Transportation and Warehousing (10.5%)
 - Retail Trade (8.8%)

 - Support for jobseekers, career enrichment, veterans, employers, etc.
 - Norman's story: Job-seeker honored by WBC at annual award ceremony for tenacity and effort…but couldn't attend awards because he was working his new job ☺.
- Community Safety & Well-Being Department
 - Support for community members in need, especially those experiencing homelessness or poverty.
 - Matt's story: Veteran who was renting a vehicle so he could work food delivery, but we connected him with a Flex Funds grant so he could buy his own vehicle.

- Commitment to Career Technical Education opportunities
- Aerospace jobs aren't in a galaxy far, far away
 - Go for Launch!: An aerospace experience for youth at CASP



- Adams County Scholarship Fund: More than \$1.1 million for students in 2025 alone
- Adams County Mayors and Youth Awards: This year, awarded to two youth who have overcome significant challenges and contributed to their communities.

Housing inventory has increased in Adams County year-over-year (YOY).




Median sale price for an Adams County home was \$514k in Feb. 2025 (↓1.2% YOY).




Continued need for homes that are affordable to those below Area Median Income, but strides are happening in this area, as well.




HOUSING MARKET: Metro area inventory

HOUSING MARKET: Adams County median price




HOUSING MARKET: Adams County cost burden

Renters	
Total renter-occupied housing units	57,572
Cost-burdened renters (Adams)	56.7%
Cost-burdened renters (Denver area)	51.2%
Cost-burdened renters (Colorado)	52.2%
Cost-burdened renters (U.S.)	50.4%

Cost-burdened is spending more than 30% of household income on housing costs (rent/mortgage and utilities).

HOUSING MARKET: Metro area affordability



Renewal Village

- Former Clarion Inn at junction of Adams and Denver Counties
- 215 units of permanent, supportive, and transitional housing
- Pairs residents with supportive services and case management
- Adams County allocated \$3.8 million in ARPA funds
- 8%, or 15-20 units, designated for Adams County residents
- Celebrated grand opening late summer '24



Hughes Station

- Rehabilitation of Brighton Housing Authority (BHA) project
- Upgrades to 120 units of affordable housing
- Adams County contributed \$600,000+ from misc.
 grant programs
- Total allocation from Adams County to BHA for last four years: >\$5 million
- Celebrated grand opening this spring



SUCCESS STORY:South Platte Crossing

- Collaborative public-private partnership
- Co-located with transit and health and social support resources
- 60 affordable apartment units
- Adams County contributed:
 - >\$1.3 million for long-term affordability for 8 units
 - \$350,000 for improved surrounding pedestrian infrastructure
- Celebrated grand opening this week!

Most retail and office development in last two decades has happened in municipal areas.




Location, location, location: Adams County offers a golden area for opportunity for warehousing, distribution, and all associated sectors because of proximity to transportation.




PROXIMITY TO TRANSPORTATION







SUCCESS STORY:Southwest Airlines University

- Southwest Airlines' state-of-the-art training facility—opened in March
- Opened near DEN in Aurora
- First official kickoff celebration of a new business opening in the Colorado Aerotropolis
- The result of significant collaboration across municipalities and partners to create economic opportunity in region
- A sign of great things to come!



- Fortune 50 company—Archer Daniels Midland—broke ground on a new facility at Rocky Mountain Rail Park last week
- Signifies an incredible opportunity for collaboration for businesses in the area
- ADM specifically chose Adams County because of location, ease of access to transportation infrastructure, and support of Adams County team
- Proof of commitment to working alongside businesses

COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT

Where we are ...

- One of only 14 licensed spaceports in the U.S.
- Designated as a Natl. General Aviation Airport (highest classification available from the FAA)
 - Reflects growth in activity, infrastructure, and regional significance
- More than 120,000+ takeoffs and landings in 2024
- Recently celebrated 40 years!
- Celebrating major new partnerships, incl. AltitudeX and Boom Technologies (you'll hear more on this soon...)





COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT

...and where we're going

- Poised to take-off! Working toward horizontal launch and helping elevate state's world-class aerospace industry
- 3,200 acres of land, with significant opportunities for industry partners to develop
- Surrounded by 7,000 additional acres of non-residential, master-planned industrial complexes
- Access to heavy rail and highways

World-class access to nature, right in our backyard

SECOND-TO-NONE OPEN SPACES

Accessible parks, open spaces, recreation, and arts



- More than 2,500 acres of parks and open space
- 60 miles of trails
- Public art installations in most parks, as well as many county buildings
- Something for everyone—playgrounds, fishing, hiking, biking, golfing, disc golfing, etc.









- Every time you support Adams County businesses, you invest in parks, trails, recreation, and open spaces
- 1/4 of 1% sales tax
- In 2024 alone, Adams County awarded >\$34 million in competitive grants and returned almost \$10 million directly to jurisdictions across the county.



Celebrating brand new parks in Adams County

- Celebrated two new parks in May:
 - City View Park
 - In Welby neighborhood
 - Created from neighborhood input
 - ADA-accessible walking paths, playgrounds, pollinator gardens, art, and more
 - Path to Wellness
 - At Riverdale Regional Park
 - Designed to reflect and remember impact of COVID-19
 - Walking path, gardens, labyrinth, art, and more




Farmland preservation

- Historic Splendid Valley:
 - Preserve agricultural land
 - Encourage local food production and consumption
 - Promote agritourism
- Farmland preserved through conservation easements, land acquired by cities/county and leased to local farmers, and Open Space Sales Tax grants and other partnerships used to protect farmland
- Since adoption of plan establishing Historic Splendid Valley:
 - 264 acres have been preserved WITH water rights
 - Total farmland preserved: **445** acres



Honoring service at the Veterans Memorial

- Adams County Veterans Memorial opened in 2023
- Replica of USS Colorado at 1/3 scale
- Since its opening, has been a place of both quiet reflection and community gathering, including for active-duty military and veterans, and for military ceremonies.
- Thriving partnership with current *USS Colorado*: Ship's sailors and command often visit the memorial and reflect on the legacy of the ship.





COMMITMENT TO SERVICE

Through high-quality programs and offerings

By community, for community: Graffiti Removal Program

- Partner with municipalities across region on graffiti removal
- Since expanding beyond unincorporated Adams County in 2021, graffiti removals increased drastically—and have increased every year since.
 - In 2021, the first year of the program expansion, 2,037 instances of graffiti were removed. In 2024, 4,032 were.
- Intentional hiring: Bringing in people with lived experience creates a more effective, thoughtful program.
- Recently awarded for excellence by Colorado City & County Management Association
- Involves community members: Residents AND businesses can report graffiti in real time, and our team will respond.



SPARCing community connections


- Following a ramping up of community-driven services during the pandemic, Adams County saw a continued need and benefit
- Launched new office at start of 2025 to ensure long-term programming that empowers community-based organizations and helps better understand resident needs: SPARC—Strategic Partnerships and Resilient Communities
- Office has launched resilience plan, neighborhood community fund, issued ARPA funds and supported grantees, and much more just six months in!
